The golf shop hours through the summer months are Monday through Sunday 6:30am until 8:00pm. The driving range hours are 12:00pm until 8:00pm on Monday's, 7:00am until 8:00pm Tuesday thru Saturday and 7:00am until 7:00pm on Sunday's. We are happy to leave golf balls for you to hit after 8:00pm Monday through Saturday but we pick the range clean on Sunday nights in preparation for maintenance on Monday morning and ask that you hit your last balls by 7:00pm. We look forward to having everyone out to dial in their games this summer.

Handicap 101

*What do I do if the golf shop is closed and I want to post my score?

You may post in the men's or women's locker rooms, you may post at home on uga.org or you may download the free GHIN app and post on your phone.

*How many holes must I play before I can post a score?

You can post a 9 hole score after 7 holes and an 18 hole score after 13 holes. To do this simply check the scorecard and find the handicap number of the remaining holes. If you are an 18 handicap then you will mark bogey for each of the remaining holes. If you are a 9 handicap you would mark bogey on the remaining holes if they are the 9 handicap or less and you would mark a par if they are higher than the 9 handicap.

*Peer Review

If you would like to conduct a peer review and leave the golf staff information please drop your review in the suggestion box that is located by the handicap computer in each of the locker rooms. The handicap committee will conduct a peer review session at the end of June.

Grounds Committee News...

Thanks to Tom Rhoades and his team, we're off to a great start to the season. There are a few remaining items that the Grounds Team will be focusing on in the coming weeks. They are working on topdressing and seeding damaged areas that have not filled in yet. All of the damaged areas in fairways and collars have been slit seeded. They have begun pulling out the old satellite boxes from around the golf course to convert our irrigation system to narrow band. Bunker edging will continue until it is complete. Lastly, they will be verticutting at a more aggressive depth this week and topdressing lightly.

The Grounds Committee is currently reviewing the golf course fairways and approaches. We've already made some preliminary markings on the front nine with the intent to lower the grass in areas that would allow higher handicap members and guests play from preferred lies. The Committee, Tom Rhoades and Jake Hanley will be reviewing the preliminary markings in the next couple of weeks.

In addition, we will be building a Memorial Garden in front of the clubhouse to honor those members who have passed away. We are going to be planting flowers and would love to have members participate, please contact the Grounds Committee for more details.

The Grounds Committee is pleased to announce the Golf Course Maintenance Standards. This document will provide the membership details of Jeremy's daily maintenance goals as well as Golf Couse Etiquette. The Mission Statement of the Golf Course Maintenance Standards is To prepare, preserve and maintain the golf course as the major club asset and to afford the opportunity to provide enjoyment to its members and guests. To protect, understand and fulfill Arnold Palmer's vision and goals for a firm, fast and fair golf challenge for all levels of player abilities.

To plan and execute programs and procedures that maintains a superior golf experience as well as enhances and protects the environment, property and aesthetics of the club.

The objectives will be to maintain the golf course so that excellent playing conditions exist for both the championship and the average golfer. The golf course should play near championship standards, within weather limitations, on a continued basis and at championship standards for certain events. These events will be determined annually by the Golf and Green Committees.

The goal of maintenance is the least amount of interference and inconsistencies as possible. Environmental stewardship and resource management will impact selecting and applying products to the golf course.

These objectives will be met within an overall annual capital and maintenance budget prepared by the Green Committee, General Manger, and Golf Course Superintendent, approved by the Board of Directors.





Golf Tips From Corey Wooley, 1st Assistant Professional: Match play pointers

The weather is warming up, and the competitive golf season is right around the corner! Stroke play and match play are one of the most common formats for competitive events. Whether you are playing in a friendly match or a high-stakes game, the rules are the same for all types of match play events. Match play rules are covered in the USGA Rules of Golf under Rule 2, but I will cover a rule that is easily misunderstood, as well as basic terms used during match play events.

Rule 2-4. Concession of a Match, Hole, or Next Stroke

A player may concede a match at any time prior to the start or conclusion of that match. This means that the entire match can be conceded, thus not requiring the further playing of holes, and your opponent would be the victor. In matches where points are awarded for each hole, your opponent would receive the maximum amount possible, and you would receive any points that you earned prior to conceding the match.

A player may concede a hole at any time prior to the start or conclusion of that hole. A player may concede a hole at any time before or during the play of that hole, thus giving their opponent the point for that hole. This situation may arise if one player is on the green in 2 while another player is stuck in the trees hitting their 7th shot; they may decide that they are unlikely to beat or tie their opponent who is on the green, and would just pick up at that point and concede the hole to their opponent.

A player may concede his opponents next stroke at any time, provided the opponent's ball is at rest. The opponent is considered to have 'holed out' with his next stroke, and the ball may be removed by either side. In most situations this rule will come in play in the form of a 'gimmie'. A player needs to make sure that it is understood that they want their opponent to pick up from where the ball currently rests, and that they are giving them their next stroke as opposed to conceding the hole completely. This can be a tactful play in a Four-ball match play format, because a player could give their opponent a putt that their opponent's partner may have benefited from seeing.

A concession may not be declined or withdrawn. If a player gives their opponent a putt, or concedes a hole, that concession cannot be withdrawn by the player giving the concession, or the opponent.

The following terms are often used throughout the course of a match play round.

Singles: A match played between two opponents, one versus the other.



Four-ball: A match played between two teams of two players, resulting in four balls being in play. This format utilizes better ball scoring, so the better score between partners is then used against their opponents' better score.

All Square: The term used to describe the score of a match that is even.

Dormie: When a player is losing by the same amount of holes that are left to play, they are considered to be dormie.

Halved: A hole is 'halved' when players have tied on a single hole.

Conceded Putt: A putt that is given to an opponent by an opposing player. If a player is laying 3, and their putt is conceded, then they scored a 4 for the hole. The opponent does not have an option of whether to pick up or not, they must take the score that was conceded to them.

Conceded hole: A hole that is won by one of the players announcing that they concede the hole to their opponent. No further play is required on that hole, the hole is won by the player receiving the concession.


UGA Women's Four-Ball Championship First Round at Bonneville Second Round at Wingpointe
